The Shabbat between Rosh Hashanah and om Kippur is called Shabbat Shuvah, Shabbat of Return." The name derives from he Haftarah (reading from the prophets) for his Shabbat, which opens with the words Hosea 14:2), "Return O Israel unto the L-rd our G-d..." According to master Kabbalist Rabbi Isaac Luria ("Ari"), the seven days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur which will always include one Sunday, one Monday, etc.) correspond to the seven days of the week. The Sunday between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur includes within self all Sundays of the year; the Monday embodies all Mondays, and so on. Shabbat Shuvah is thus the archetypal Shabbat -- the uncture in time at which we are empowered o influence every Shabbat of our year.
